

FOOTHILLS AREA TRANSMISSION DEVELOPMENT SOUTH CALGARY PROJECT UPDATE

MACLEOD TRAIL AND STONEY TRAIL INTERSECTION



PROJECT OVERVIEW


In February 2014, ENMAX Power Corporation (ENMAX) distributed an information package to stakeholders about a proposed 138 kV transmission line between ENMAX No. 65 Substation (intersection of Stoney Trail and 88 Street SE) and ENMAX No. 41 Substation (213 Shalom Way SW). This transmission line is needed to prevent transmission line overloads that would impact the reliability of power in the South Calgary area.

In late August 2014, ENMAX submitted a Facilities Application to the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) for the proposed transmission line and the application is currently under review.

Alberta Transportation (AT) originally advised ENMAX the proposed routing for both the preferred and alternate routes at the intersection of Macleod Trail and Stoney Trail was acceptable. However, in late fall, AT advised ENMAX that both routes would conflict with the construction and operation of the future interchange, and that the location of some of the transmission poles for the proposed preferred and alternate routes had to be relocated.

As a result, in March 2015, ENMAX filed an addendum to Facility Application No. 1610807, amending the proposed preferred and alternate transmission routes at the intersection of Macleod Trail and Stoney Trail to accommodate AT's request. The proposed preferred route would now cross Macleod Trail north of the interchange. It was ENMAX's understanding that AT would not accept a route that would cross Macleod Trail on the south side of the interchange.

In May, AT determined it would now consider a variant of our preferred route south of the interchange as shown above, although not favoured. ENMAX understands that some residents may prefer this route variant. However, after considering this new information, ENMAX has determined it would continue to stay with the proposed routes in our application because:



- the future state of the interchange is still a conceptual design, subject to change and may result in possible pole relocations once finalized. The proposed preferred route minimizes the need to relocate poles and impose further costs to ratepayers
- the variant to the preferred route would introduce significant safety concerns such as heavy construction equipment in close proximity to energized lines during construction as well as high speed traffic close to transmission poles once the future interchange is in place
- the estimated cost for the route variant is an additional \$450,000 over the preferred route

The AUC has set a hearing date for this application commencing August 24, 2015 at 9 a.m. at the Grey Eagle Resort & Casino. For additional details on how to participate, please refer to the AUC brochure included in this package or visit the AUC website and reference proceeding 3386.
