1. Project cost estimates

A cost estimate for your project is used to help you determine next steps and potential budget. A cost estimate typically means we have not visited your site and we do not have the benefit of any detailed engineering which is required to provide an actual quote.

ENMAX Power conducts a desktop exercise using past knowledge from similar projects, as well as virtual imagery of your site to create this very rough estimate.

Due to the high-level nature of this review, cost estimates should be considered as information only and not as a firm or final quote for the work. When requesting a ballpark cost estimate, you should be aware that any range provided to you is non-binding and should be considered a rough estimate of costs based on limited or incomplete information.

Once the scope of work has been agreed on between yourself and ENMAX Power, a detailed quote will be provided for planning/budgeting purposes.

2. Project timeline estimates

When a timeline is offered for a project, it cannot consider complexity or changes in scope, material delays, site conditions, season, inclement weather, stakeholder engagement, customer delays including payment not in accordance with the quotation letters, third party involvement, permitting, availability of labour resources or other considerations/circumstances that may arise that may extend the overall duration of the project. Scheduling cannot be guaranteed based on an estimate.

3. Initial project payments

If an initial project payment is requested for your project, it will be used towards resources required to establish a detailed quote and scope of work including:

- A project manager or project contact.
- Engineering and construction resources to scope and design your project in accordance with ENMAX Power requirements and applicable codes/standards/specifications/statutes.

4. Project cost quotes

Upon receiving complete information, our team will initiate design and engineering activities. You will receive a formal quote for costs as well as a proposed timeline **ONLY** after our team has been able to visit your site and assess the specific requirements for your project. **You (or the person requesting the services)** will need to accept the quote in writing before permitting is initiated and construction activities scheduled.
